

Please read over the following information carefully to be fully prepared for your Roundtable, Expert Encounter, or Networking Lounge virtual chat.

In the event you run into technical difficulties, or to prevent them, please read over these Video Chat Troubleshooting Tips:

If you are an Attendee or Exhibitor encountering difficulties connecting to video chat, please check the following:

1. Use Chrome or Firefox
2. Disconnect from VPN
 - If the exhibitor or attendee is logging in from an office and cannot turn off their VPN, they will need to have their network administrator unblock UDP ports 10000-30000
 - if they are working remote, either turning off VPN, or connecting from personal computer gets around this, as does connecting through the app on a device
3. If you are in the office, try another network (some offices have robust firewalls that will block the video chat.)
4. Clear your web browser history and cache
5. Check your Internet Connection
6. Close any other tabs using a lot of bandwidth.
7. If you are at home, make sure you are not also using streaming services like Netflix, etc. that could impact your available bandwidth.
8. Use a hardwired internet connection if possible
9. If you have to use WIFI, make sure you are close to the WIFI device.
10. In the event of a technical issue within the virtual platform, ASRM will provide a Zoom call for your Roundtable.

Once active, this is how you and your virtual chat attendees will join your virtual chat. Also note the Speaker has loaded a picture. You can also create a speaker biography, update your speaker profile information (credentials, spelling of your name, affiliation, add social media accounts, etc.), and upload a copy of slides/handouts for attendees.

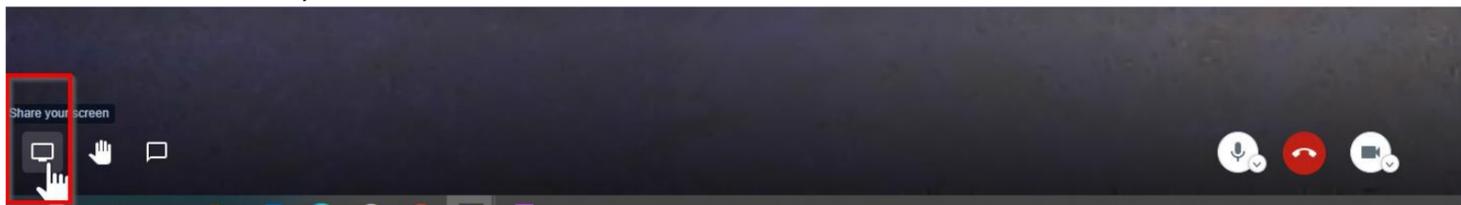
